This bibliography contains the same information as in Fig. 4.1, but uses the author–date system. I have picked out the main differences.

- ① Unlike the short-title system, the date immediately follows the author's or editor's name and full stops are generally used to separate the elements (apart from place of publication and publisher).
- ② Article and chapter titles are not put in quotes.
- ③ The volume number is separated from the page number(s) by a colon.
- ④ When the list contains more than one work by the same author, published in the same year, distinguish between them by calling one 'a', the next 'b' and so on.
